## Appendix E: Task 5 - Identify key stakeholders with expertise in this area and, through semi-structured interviews, secure their views on what the WSD Bill should contain.

To achieve this task, rather than semi-structured interviews, to engage with a greater number of people we planned three interactive workshop sessions to identify key stakeholders and discuss their views for the WSD Bill.

We completed two stakeholder engagement workshops, targeting specific individuals and organisations and held a session at the Alliance's annual conference to engage with the international development community.

We allowed for open discussion, but framed this by asking stakeholders some of the following questions:

- What would you wish the proposed Bill to do?
- In 5 10 years' time, what three things would you wish to be seeing as a result of a WSD Bill?
- How could this bill deliver policy coherence for sustainable development?
- How could Scotland take account of the impacts of domestic policy on other parts of the world?
- What is required to ensure global impact is considered and action is taken by public bodies and local authorities?
- How could the Scottish public sector be made accountable for the international impact of Scottish policy?
- What are the most important international impacts of Scotland's domestic policies?
- How can the bill be monitored and bodies held accountable?
