POLICY COHERENCE FOR DEVELOPMENT

Policy coherence for development (PCD) considers the global implications of all government actions. It ensures the positive aspects of our aid programme are enhanced, not undermined, by other areas of policy and practice. NIDOS facilitated our members to produce a key report, Scotland's Place in Building a Just World: Shaping a Coherent International Development Policy for Scotland, calling for a PCD approach in Scotland. Reponses to this report show cross-party consensus in Scotland on a PCD approach.

SCOTLAND V POVERTY

A group of 26 NIDOS members came together to produce Scotland v Poverty, an exhibition and website calling for a more just world and highlighting why this is not a matter of charity but of rights. The exhibition, which was launched during the Commonwealth Games, demonstrates some of the ways that Scottish organisations are contributing to poverty reduction and global justice and how the public can get involved.
