Example of Responsible Innovation Co-design tech to centre voice/actions of People of Colour

Set in virtual replica of the **Western Scottish Highlands** in 2045, constructed from real satellite images

Seven narratives and mini-games

Real-life climate actions of Minoritised Ethnic-led organisations/initiatives across Scotland e.g. solarising institutions of worship led by Glasgow Central Mosque, rainwater collection, wildflower meadows, circular economy, wildlife pond, urban farming, women's rights in cycling

Listen to and learn from characters voiced by and created in the likeness of real Minoritised Ethnic people in Scotland
